2022 President's Inaugural Address

Good evening, everyone. It is with great honor that I accept the position of president of the Montgomery County Medical Society. This Society has been in existence since 1849 and has stood for the ethical treatment of patients and provided support to physicians in the community. Since its inception there have been advances in the medical field alongside seismic historical events: civil war and two world wars; the development of private health insurance; the Medicare and Medicaid programs; and the Spanish Flu & COVID-19 pandemics. Now in the 21st century there is a shift in how and where doctors work. Doctors are comfortable with the idea of being employed by a health organization. Today's doctors make quality of life a priority and they speak up for social justice and strive to reduce health disparities. Who knows where this country and the field of medicine will be in another 100 years. We can only hope and dream that it continues to advance for the betterment of our communities.

We have witnessed that physicians have lost authority and strength. For a variety of reasons, the percentage of physicians working for a hospital or health system has risen to exceed the percentage of doctors in private practice. The health systems are looking to cut costs and are using physician extenders in ways that decrease the need for physicians. These changes have resulted in less physicians in the community and changing priorities and alliances. An employed physician may have a limited budget to use for membership fees in various societies. An employed physician may not even see the need to join a medical society and network with colleagues. This threatens not only the strength of the Society but also the health of our communities. Our Society will have to evolve.

Let me tell you a little about myself first. I am originally from New Orleans, LA., and a first generation American. My parents came from Colombia, South America, in the early

1960s. Their determination to make a better life for their family brought them to America. My parents instilled a culture of hard work and respect that guided me and my siblings into successful careers. I joined the U.S. Air Force which afforded me the opportunity for an outstanding education. I came to Dayton to work as a staff anesthesiologist and pain management physician at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. I brought my wife, Dr. Sheela Barhan, with me. Sheela is an obstetrician-gynecologist and associate professor at Wright State University School of Medicine. After finishing my active duty service commitment in the U.S. Air Force, I completed a fellowship in Pain Medicine at The Ohio State University. I then started my solo private practice in interventional pain management in Dayton in 2003. I also completed an MBA degree with a concentration in Health Care Management and Economics from Wright State University. We raised two successful daughters, Lalita & Alicia who chose careers in business and public policy. Organized medicine has always been an interest of mine. I am President of the Ohio Society of Interventional Pain Physicians and serve on the Board of Directors for the national organization. I'm thrilled to now focus on my community as MCMS President.

The challenges our society faces will force us to make hard choices. My pledge is to lead the Society through our period of change and make it better. Our executive board has been tasked with modernizing and streamlining the Society. We will appeal to new sensibilities and desires of the local community. Dr. Thomas Proctor is leading our Mission Taskforce to address our new mission goals. To get the word out and create a sense of community we are working hard to develop our virtual presence on the internet. Please check out our new website as created under the direction of Dr. John Corker. We have made adjustments to reduce the prior bureaucracy and expensive infrastructure. Thank you to Gerri Creel for her hard work during this transition. We look forward to keeping a positive and respectful dialogue with the local healthcare systems.
